

Understanding Your Scores in Renweb

Each standards-based class will have three Renweb categories: Success Skills, Evidence of Proficiency, and Proficiency Scale Scores.

Success Skills you teacher may use a scale or may record points for each assignment, but neither the scale scores or the points will count against your grade. This category could contain nonacademic factors such as attendance, participation, and preparedness for class. But it could also contain practice work done outside of class. While this category does not affect your grade, the nonacademic factors and the practice work will give your teacher valuable feedback that will help them guide your learning.

The **Evidence of Proficiency** category will record points based on the 4-point scale in the proficiency scale. While this category does not directly record points that affect your grade, your teacher uses the work in the category as “mounting evidence” toward your summative score for each standard/learning goal. This means that your teacher will examine the pattern of scores from the assignments and assessments connected to a particular standard/learning goal and will use those scores to assign a proficiency scale score for that standard. This category will contain assignments such as practice work done in class, quizzes, and final assessments. Each assignment will have the standard and the level of proficiency attached to it. An example could be **GCER1 - I can write precise claims. (Level 3)**. The assignment will then be scored according to the proficiency level.

The **Proficiency Scale Score** category will record points on the 100-point scale for each standard you have attempted. This score is assigned from the assignments and assessments that you have attempted in class, the mounting evidence of your work on a particular standard/learning goal. These scores will be averaged by Renweb and will give you a traditional grade.

The categories will be numbered when entered into the gradebook: 1. Success Skills, 2. Evidence of Proficiency, and 3. Proficiency Scale Scores.

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Each standards-based class will have three Renweb categories: Success Skills, Formative Assessments, and Summative Scores.

Success Skills

- Your teacher may use a scale score or may record points for each assignment
- Neither the scale scores or the points will count against your grade
- Success Skills could contain nonacademic factors such as attendance, participation, and preparedness for class.
- Success Skills could also contain practice work done outside of class
- The nonacademic factors and the practice work will give your teacher valuable feedback that will help him/her guide your learning.

Evidence of Proficiency

- Teacher records points based on the 4-point scale in the proficiency scale
- While assignments recorder in this section do not directly record points that affect your grade, your teacher uses the work in the category as “mounting evidence” toward your proficiency scale score for each standard/learning goal.
- Mounting evidence means that the teacher will examine the pattern of scores from the assignments and assessments connected to a particular standard/learning goal and will use those scores to assign a summative score for that standard
- Evidence of Proficiency will contain assignments such as practice work done in class, quizzes, and final assessments.
- Each assignment will have the standard/learning goal and the level of proficiency attached to it. An example: **GCER1 - I can write precise claims. (Level 3)**
- The assignment will then be scored according to the proficiency level.

Proficiency Scale Score

- Teacher records points on the 100-point scale for each standard you have attempted
- A score is assigned from the assignments and assessments that you have attempted in class (Evidence of Proficiency category)
- Teachers uses the mounting evidence of your work on a particular standard.
- The final scores from the proficiency scales used throughout the semester will be averaged by Renweb and will give you a traditional grade.

The categories will be numbered when entered into the gradebook: 1. Success Skills, 2. Formative Assessments, and 3. Summative Scores

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
